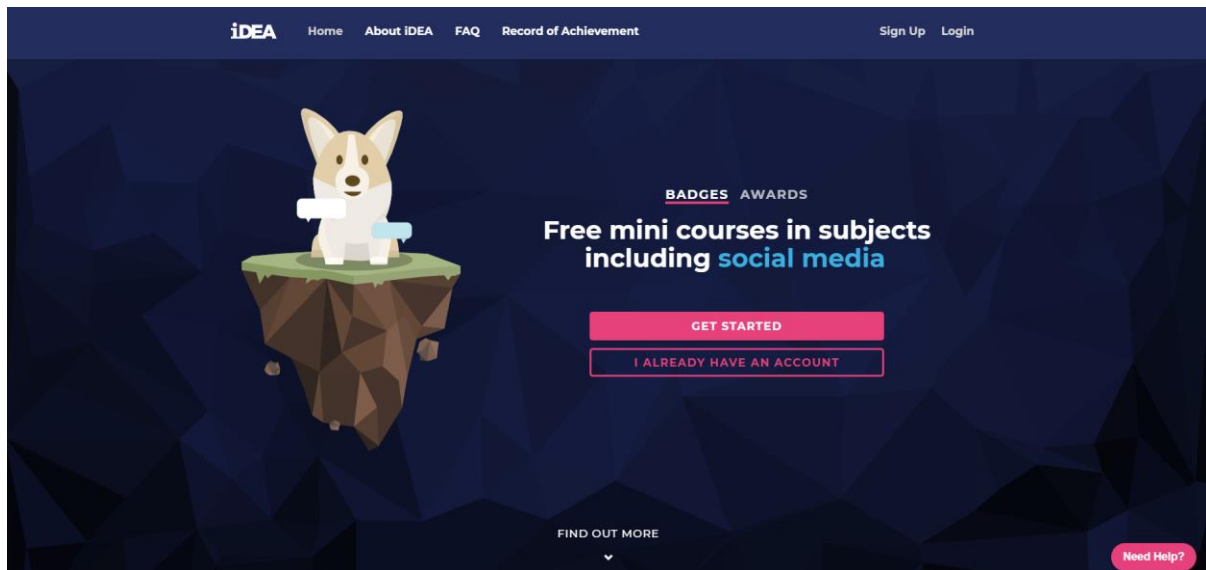
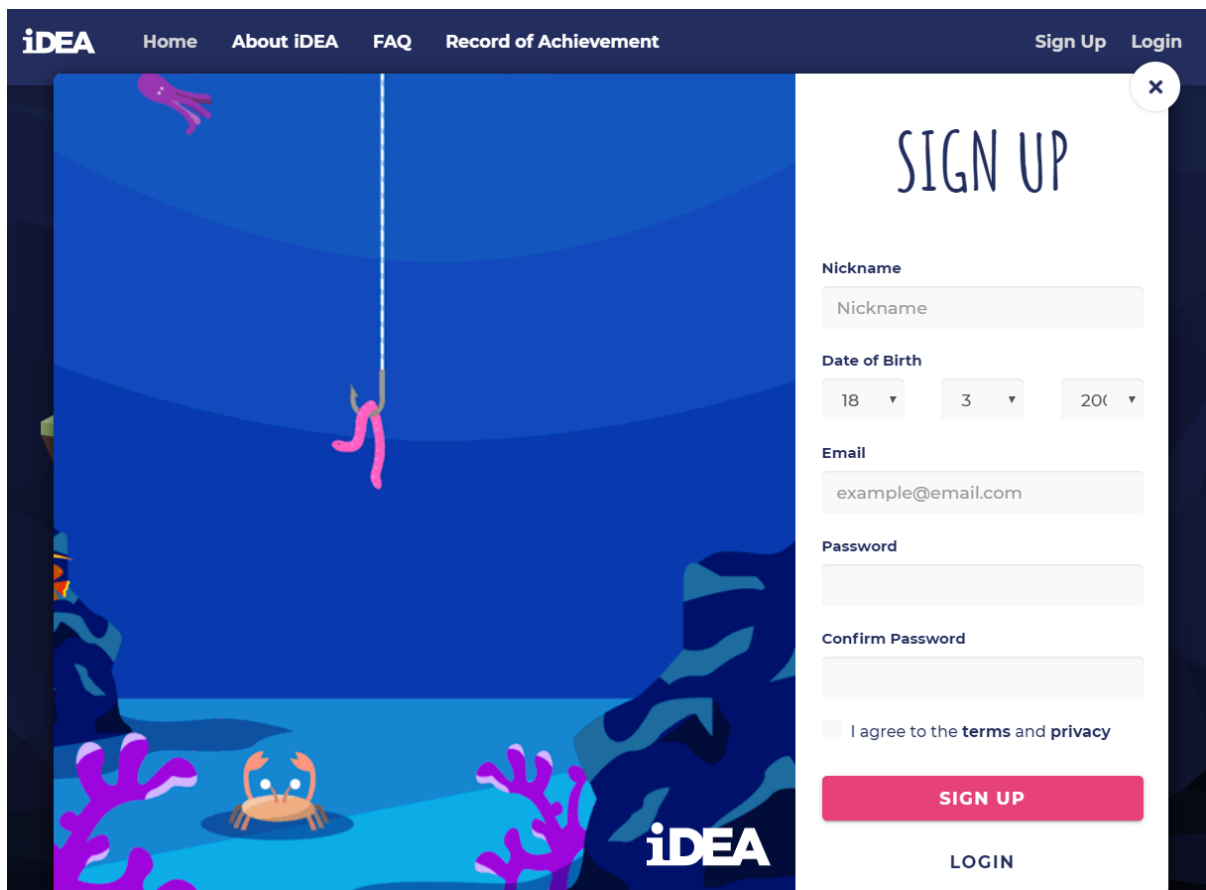


How to set up your account on iDEA (IT students in Year 7, 8 and 9)

1. Go to the following website: www.idea.org.uk. From any device - even works on your smart phone!

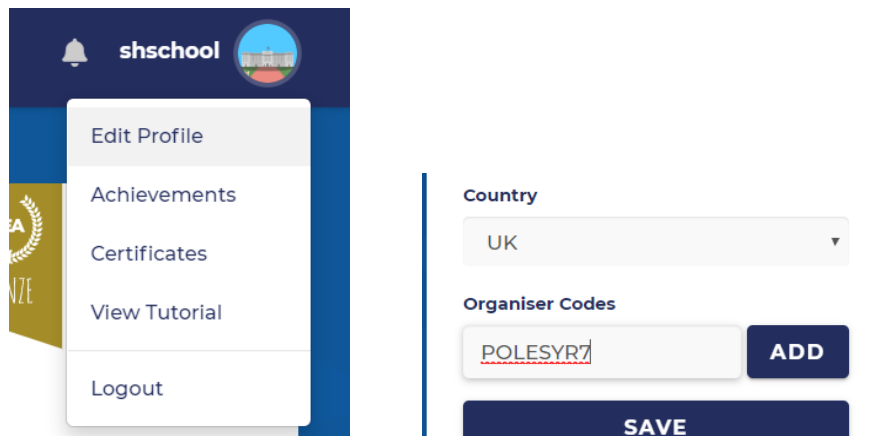


2. Click 'GET STARTED'.



3. Complete the 'SIGN UP' details including an appropriate nickname, your school email address which is your firstname.surname@polesworthstudents.org and include a suitable password. Click to agree to the terms and privacy then click 'SIGN UP'. PLEASE NOTE: If you are under 13 years you will need to put your parent/guardians

name and email address as they will need to give permission for you to access the site.



4. Before you begin, go to your account (top right of the screen where your nickname will be shown) and click 'Edit Profile'. You will need to add an organiser code so that we can track how well you are doing. You will need to input the 'Organisers Codes' for your year group. The codes are as follows:

Year 7 – POLESYR7

Year 8 – POLESYR8

Year 9 – POLESYR9

Select your country and input the code then click the 'ADD' button and then the 'SAVE' button.
