<p>Which exam board and course are used?</p>	<p>OCR GCSE Business (J204)</p>
<p>What curriculum topics are being covered this year?</p>	<p>Operations: Production processes, quality of goods and services, sales process and customer service, consumer law, business location and working with suppliers.</p> <p>Influences on business: ethical and environmental considerations, the economic climate and globalisation</p> <p>Finance for business: role of the finance function, sources of finance, revenues, costs, profits and loss, break-even, cash and cash flow</p> <p>The interdependent nature of business. How interdependencies underpin all business activity across all functional areas</p>
<p>How many exams have students got and what is covered in each one?</p>	<p>4x internal tests based upon the 4 topics above. Operations Management, Finance, Influences on Business and interdependencies.</p> <p>Each of the topics will be assessed through internally marked End of Topic Tests. These will be in the form of 50-minute tests comprised of questions taken from previous exam papers. These will be completed in exam conditions (timed, in silence, without prior knowledge of the questions themselves). Students will be given several weeks warning that the test is approaching.</p> <p>2 x external examinations (summer exam series 2024).</p> <p>Paper 1: Business 1: business activity, marketing and people (J204/01).</p> <p>Paper 2: Business 2: operations, finance and influences on business (J204/02).</p>
<p>What should students be focusing on?</p>	<p>The main difficulty that GCSE students face is the sheer amount of content that needs to be learned. Students are strongly advised to revisit material covered in lesson and put together revision notes/posters/mind maps as they go rather than leaving it until each topic has been completed.</p> <p>Students should pay particular attention to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learning key terms and making use of business language in written responses. • Applying business theories to real life business examples i.e. through the case studies used in booklets and relevant examples of businesses in the news. • Being able to construct in-depth responses considering the implications of business decisions/recommendations and justifying why businesses should make certain decision (skills of analysis and evaluation). • Using past paper to improve examination technique and recall knowledge
<p>What is the best way for parents to support students in this subject?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Test them on their knowledge of key terms. • Ensure that your child is revising for end of topic tests. • Encourage them to take an interest in businesses reported in the news to help them apply their classroom learning to real life business examples. • Help ensure homework and deadlines are met with relevant level of detail and use of key terms. • Support attendance at intervention and/or revision sessions.

They will have 8 booklets of information across both years (2x People booklets). • Revision guides are available to purchase on the school shop • In addition to physical copies of these booklets, all materials have been uploaded to Microsoft Teams and can be accessed remotely.
