Explain religious and secular views about homosexuality, including references in the Bible (gender equality, prejudice and discrimination). 3. Explain religious and secular views about sexual relationships before and outside of marriage (adultery, pre-marital sex, cohabitation and promiscuity). 4. Identify different types of contraception and family planning giving both religious and secular views about them. 5. Describe the nature and purpose of marriage within Christianity. 6. Identify what divorce is and reasons for divorce and remarrying. 7. Explain ethical arguments related to divorce, including those based on the sanctity of marriage vows and compassion. 8. Examine the nature of families from a religious and non-religious perspective - highlighting different types of families and roles of people in those families. 9. Identify contemporary family issues. 10. 20. Make links between Christian beliefs about the role of Christ in salvation and atonement.

Religion, Peace and Conflict -

21. Explain the meaning and significance of peace, justice, forgiveness and reconciliation in relation to conflict.
22. Identify views about the use of violence in relation to conflict and examine the response to victims of conflict/violence - one present day religious organisation.
23. Examine the meaning of terrorism and its use within conflict.
24. Describe reasons for war, including greed, self-defence and retaliation.
25. Explain the just war theory, including the criteria for a just war.
26. Understand the definition of a Holy war and how it might influence believers today.
27. Identify both religious and non-religious views about pacifism and how it links to conflict.
28. Explain contrasting views of religion as a cause of war, violence and peace-making in the contemporary world - including individuals influenced by religious teaching.
29. Compare contrasting views about the use of nuclear weapons, including nuclear deterrence.
30. Describe religious and non-religious views about the use of weapons of mass destruction.

Islam Beliefs -

31. Make links between the six articles of faith in Sunni Islam and five roots of Usul ad-Din in Shi'a Islam.
32. Explain key beliefs about Allah and the nature of Allah.
33. Name key words that are used to describe the nature of Allah.
34. Identify different ideas about Allah's relationship with the world - transcendent and immanent.
35. Describe and explain the nature and role of angels in Islam identifying key angels.
36. Explain key beliefs about life after death in Islam.
37. Identify links between the nature of Allah, human responsibility and life after death.
38. Explain prophethood including the role and importance of the key prophets Muhammad, Ibrahim and Adam.
